# For Faculty: Advising Students about Audits, Withdrawals and Incompletes

TMCC will receive funding for students who stay in the class for the entire term and receive a letter grade, A-F, audit or incomplete. TMCC does not receive funding for W or FN grades. We therefore encourage you to contact students who stop coming to classes or appear to be having trouble, and refer them to TMCC support services. The Admissions and Records Office will begin sending the names of students who have withdrawn to faculty members each day. If it is indeed in a student's best interest not to receive a letter grade, encourage students to audit the class instead. In this way students can stay in the class, receive all information and be better prepared to repeat the course.

### Audits

- If a student wishes to change to or from an **audit**, this must be done by the designated deadline date. See the <u>Admissions Dates and Deadlines</u> webpage for specific dates.
- Note that this is the same date as the last day for a student to withdraw (for nondynamically-dated classes).

### Withdrawals

- If a student wished to withdraw, this must be done by the designated deadline date. See the <u>Admissions Dates</u> <u>and Deadlines</u> webpage for specific dates.
- Faculty are encouraged to withdraw students for non-attendance as soon as they are aware the student is not attending. Preferably during the first week of class so that other students may register.

### Incompletes

A temporary grade of incomplete ("I") may be granted to a student at the end of the semester if the student is performing passing work in the course, and there are extenuating circumstances (beyond the student's control) that prevent the student from completing the course requirements by the end of the instructional period. Non-attendance, poor performance or requests to repeat the course are unacceptable reasons for issuance of the "I" grade. A conference between the instructor and the student should be held prior to the due date for grades at the end of the semester and a detailed statement describing the work to be completed must be signed by the instructor and the student, with copies to the department chair or dean.

Students have until the last day of the next regular semester in which to make up assignments or examinations for a course in which they receive an incomplete. (Summer and Winter Sessions are not defined as a semester for this purpose.) Failure to do so will result in the incomplete grade being changed to an 'F' grade. Students must make arrangements with the instructor who originally issued the incomplete or, if the instructor is not available, the department chair or dean to complete the requirements. A class with an "I" grade cannot be used as a prerequisite for another class.
