- TMCC Grants, State Grants, and some scholarships require the FAFSA and are available to students who do not qualify for the Pell Grant.

The FAFSA only gives students the Pell Grant

 - Multiple Grants (Pell Grant, Silver State Opportunity Grant, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant, TMCC Need Grant, Board of Regents GIA Grant)
 - Work Study/Student Employment Opportunities
 - Federal Direct Stafford Loans

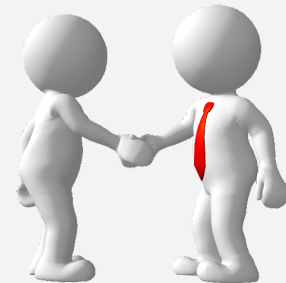
